#### TRADITION NINE

"C.A., as such, ought never be organized; but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve."

When Tradition Nine was first written, it said, "Cocaine Anonymous needs the least possible organization." In years since then, we have changed our minds about that, Today, we are able to say with assurance that Cocaine Anonymous—C.A. as a whole—should never be organized at all. Then, in seeming contradiction, we proceed to create special service boards and committees which in themselves are organized...It is clear now that we ought never to name boards to govern us, but it is usually clear that we shall always need to authorize workers to serve us. It is the difference between the spirit of vested authority and the spirit of service, two concepts that are sometimes poles apart...C.A. has to function, but at the same time it must avoid those dangers of great wealth, prestige, and entrenched power which necessarily tempt other societies. Though Tradition Nine at first sight seems to deal with a purely practical matter, in its actual operation it discloses a society without organization, animated only by the spirit of service—a true fellowship.

## **Our Convention**

Our State Convention is coming upon us real soon, and I for one am looking forward to it. I never want to forget what my first experience at a State Convention was like. It was here in Nebraska in 1997 when I was somewhat still in the Newcomer period, my first year of Recovery. I had just gotten a car back and I was happy that it resembled a can-opener. I had to climb in through the passenger side to drive. Most mechanics told me that it was a death trap, but they just didn't understand. Walking to meetings, catching the bus and depending on others for rides had gotten pretty old. I had just returned to from the dead. When I had a nice car I had taken those material gifts for granted, so just having a car of any kind, even a can-opener, was like a Cadillac to me.

I remember how I was anticipating that Convention, not knowing what to expect. Needless to say, the can-opener broke down halfway there and it was raining Cats-and-Dogs. There just so happened to be a tow truck near by but I was more worried about getting to the Convention then the car.

When I arrived at the front door I was greeted with a lot of Love. They gave me a nametag with my name and the C.A. logo on it. I just stared at that nametag. For some reason I felt that the whole Convention was just for me. I met one guy who had hitchhiked from Oklahoma just to come to the Convention; that blew me away as well. I sat in on a Marathon Meeting that was so much more powerful then the regular meeting I was attending. I also remember meeting and taking pictures with a group of addicts from Michigan. I hung out with them and the whole time we were together they gave me Hope for my Recovery. What a Spiritual Experience!

As I looked around the Convention, I noticed that there weren't any conventioneers running the show, but a bunch of Cocaine Addicts like myself running and conducting everything from selling the memorabilia, setting up for the speakers, ordering the meals and setting the tone for the Convention. That experience was enough to make me want to stick around a little longer. It gave me some insight to the behind-the-scenes goings on. Let's put it this way; it's kind of like making sausage, it may look like a mess but the end product was very good.

It always amazes me when I think about how my Higher Power could put so many addicts together without any of them killing each other.
